The “Mike” March 6, 7 2020



Mike Sakatch’s wonderful talent, dedication, and infectious good humour enriched the lives of thousands of musicians and we participants of the West Valley Winds Workshop count ourselves among them. The workshop has had continued success because of the driving force of Mike. He knew the importance of enhancing adult music programming by offering exciting learning opportunities with excellent guest directors in an atmosphere of fun and camaraderie. He encouraged Westwinds Wind Orchestra members to take advantage of the workshop every year, suggested guest directors from his extensive list of contacts, provided a full concert percussion section, put together the rhythm section for our Jazz Jam Social and led the fun!

Through the years the workshop grew into a two-band format with participants from Alberta, British Columbia and Saskatchewan. Some guest directors, when contacted said, “I have heard about this wonderful workshop and wanted to come someday. I am so glad you have invited me!” We have become “known”!

With Mike’s passing, while we mourn the loss of our wonderful friend and mentor, we want to honour him and keep his memory. With Joan’s (his wife) gracious permission, the workshop is being renamed the “**Mike Sakatch Band Workshop**” - affectionately known as “**The Mike**”. Joan was delighted with the idea and said that Mike always believed that the workshop was a vital part of our community music.

The Event

This is the fifteenth annual **Mike Sakatch Band Workshop**, hosted by the Valley Winds Music Association (Canmore) and Westwinds Music Society (Calgary). The entire workshop, Friday evening and all-day Saturday, will be held in full ensemble under the direction of our **guest conductors, Dr. Jacqueline Dawson** (University of Manitoba) and **Mr. Douglas Macaulay** (West Vancouver Youth Band).

After the Friday evening sight reading session, everyone is invited to a party featuring our own **jazz jam at the Canmore Golf & Curling Club dining room**. Our rhythm section will lay down the beat and all are welcome to join in or simply listen and socialize with friends.


The Conductors



Noted for her unique ability to create an inspiring ensemble experience and sculpt an impressive wind band sound, **Jacquie Dawson** has had a marked impact on the wind band community in Manitoba for two decades. She is in demand as a guest conductor, clinician and adjudicator across Canada. Jacquie has been published in the Canadian Music Educator Journal and the Canadian Winds Journal and has presented at numerous conferences across Canada including the Canadian Music Educators’ Association National Conference. Her research interests are in community music, the relationship between music education and the cultivation of community, as well as inclusion in instrumental music education

Jacquie’s conducting engagements have included the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra New Music Festival, Alberta Band Association Wind Symphony, the Manitoba Junior and Intermediate Honour Bands, the PEI Provincial Honors Band, and the International Music Camp. Adjudicating engagements include Musicfest Canada, University of Victoria Bandfest, the Cantando Festivals, Alberta Band Association Festival of Bands and the upcoming Boao International Music Festival in Boas, China.

The Manitoba Band Association in partnership with a consortium of over sixty participants/organizations from Canada and the United States, commissioned the work Transcendent light composed by Kenley Kristofferson in memory of former Manitoba Band Association Executive Director, Ken Epp. Jacquie chaired the project and conducted the Winnipeg Wind Ensemble in the world premiere performance. Jacquie also attends and presents at many conferences and workshops, such as the Sunrise School Division Music Teachers Workshop, and the Manitoba Band Association Prelude Conference. As well, Jacquie is in her 10th season as the Artistic Director of the Winnipeg Wind Ensemble.



Douglas Macaulay works as a Conductor, Composer, Arranger, Educator, and Producer. He has composed for a wide variety of genre including band, orchestra, film, and dozens of theatrical scores (a recipient of the Jesse Richardson award for outstanding Theatrical Composition). He is an independent record producer, music consultant for the film and television industry and has worked as Music Director for CBC Television and Radio, the Pacific Music Industry Association, The Cambie Street Brass Band, the Vancouver Community College Wind Ensemble, Theatre Under the Stars, and the Vancouver Firefighters Band. Most notably, he is the co-founder and Artistic and Managing Director of Con Brio Festivals where, since 2000, he has produced the respected Whistler Music Festival and Sun Peaks Music Festival. Doug was recognized in 2013 with the BC Music Educators’ Distinguished Service Award and in 2015, he was invested as an associate member of the prestigious American Bandmasters Association as the representative of Con Brio Festivals.

Currently, Doug is in demand as adjudicator and clinician at music festivals throughout Canada and the U.S. In his own community, Doug was instrumental in the creation of the unique and visionary “Community Music Hall” – a dedicated large ensemble rehearsal space within the new West Vancouver Community Centre. The facility provides space to many community music ensembles and is home to the West Vancouver Youth Band for which Doug has been Principal Conductor and Program Director since 1993. During that time, the WVYB has grown from 39 musicians in three ensembles to nearly 200 in five ensembles.
